Hospice is about helping people make the most out of their remaining lives, by providing free quality palliative care and support to guide people through this last chapter in their lives and help them to live every moment in whatever way is important to them. We work hard to achieve these goals and have a team of highly-experienced health professionals and management to ensure that happens.

Hospice Eastern Bay of Plenty is a nongovernment organisation and relies heavily on contracts from Te Whatu Ora, Health NZ, as well as the generosity of our volunteers, sponsors, donors and the community. Above all, our priority has always been, and will always continue to be, our patients and their families. Last year, 162 referrals were received which costs more to manage than what we were provided funding for from Health NZ. We will always continue to manage referrals over and above what we have been provided funding for, to ensure everyone in the Eastern Bay of Plenty is provided the opportunity to receive free Hospice care however, these extra costs need to be fundraised.

The funds raised to cover this additional cost is achieved through our various fundraising events and activities, sponsorships, donations, grants, hospice shops and business operational income. Thank you to our generous community for helping this compassionate service be able to accommodate everyone in need.

Message from the Board Chair

A huge thank you to all the Hospice EBOP staff, volunteers and trustees for contributing to another effective year fulfilling Hospice EBOP's mission to provide excellent, compassionate palliative care for everyone throughout the Eastern Bay of Plenty. The organisation remains in a healthy financial position and looks forward to continuing to care for our community. With the lift in all Covid-19 restrictions, Hospice EBOP is happy to be able to return to full function.

In the last financial year, the clinical team welcomed three new nurses who have been a great addition to the team, the Hospice Shops were able to resume normal trade and fundraising events could start to be planned. The Hospice EBOP staff worked hard this year to successfully reach their agreed cultural goal of 'Building a happy, healthy, trusting environment' and after only three months, staff highly rated Hospice EBOP as 8.2/10 for this goal. Feedback from our patients and their whānau was also verv positive with 94% and 95% satisfaction from their experience with Hospice EBOP.

Despite numerous challenges presented last year for the clinical team, Hospice EBOP maintained the contracted palliative care services to help people in our community to live well when their life is limited. Thanks to Pare Corkran, Clinical Services Manager

and the clinical team who worked tirelessly to ensure the community continued to receive the compassionate, professional palliative care that they deserved.

One of the highlights for the year was the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between Hospice EBOP and Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi to help address palliative care nurse shortages in the Eastern Bay of Plenty, through a new scholarship for Te Ōhanga Mataora: Bachelor of Health Science Māori Nursing Students. Thanks to Peter Bassett, former Chief Executive and trustee Amohaere Tangitu for their work to develop and formalise this longstanding relationship. Hospice EBOP look forward to supporting students with their palliative care studies.

With our fundrasing environment still presenting some challenges during the past financial year, Hospice EBOP relied heavily on grant funding along with our Hospice Shops, donations and sponsorships to raise the essential funds needed. We would like to thank all of the generous organisatons that provided grant funding for Hospice EBOP during this year, your assistance is appreciated. NZ Community trust provided \$45,000, Aoteasroa Gaming Trust provided \$32,240 and The Lion Foundation and Lotteries both provided \$20,000 plus many more generous grants were received.

The three Hospice Shops performed well thanks to our

incredible shop staff, volunteers and community. Wendy Wright, Shops Manager has done an amazing job to provide a fantastic experience for our community, a safe and friendly environment for our volunteers and a great platform for Hospice EBOP to make significant proceeds to help bridge the funding gap.

Once again we would like to thank everyone who contributed to the success of the 2022/2023 financial year and also Peter Bassett, former Chief Executive for his effective, competent and professional leadership during his seven year tenure as Chief Executive. We all look forward to a new year with no Covid restrictions and a full clinical team. Thank you to the Eastern Bay of Plenty community for your continued support for Hospice EBOP.

FUNDRAISING & VOLUNTEERS

Farmer's Remembrance Tree Campaign

Raised \$7,006 for Hospice EBOP

Every Christmas Season for the last 9 years, Farmers have run a fundraiser, raising money for their local Hospice provider. This years' campaign ran from November 17th through to December 24th.

The campaign creates awareness of Hospice services through signage in the store and social media.

Farmers had set up a little area for this campaign by the entrance of the store that featured a Christmas Tree, a pull up banner explaining what the event was about and a stand with pens and tags to write messages to loved ones. Customers were invited to write messages and place them on the tree.

At the tills, Farmers sold their limited edition Hospice Baubles and the staff invited customers to donate to Hospice when checking out.

The total funds raised was \$7006 with all the proceeds going to Hospice EBOP.

The feedback from the Store Manager this year was very positive with customers always keen to donate to Hospice. The Hospice fundraiser is one of their biggest fundraisers of the year and provides great publicity for Hospice over Farmers busy Christmas period.

Hospice Awareness Week

15th - 19th May, 2023

This year for Hospice Awareness week, the theme was 'It's OK to feel how you feel'. The campaign featured hospice patients and their whānau sharing their emotional journeys of dying, and hospice care. With this theme in mind, we invited the public to talk to our nurses.

Each day, we had a nurse at the Whakatāne Hospice Shop over their lunch break, and one day each at the Ōpōtiki and Kawerau shops. Customers were invited to talk to the nurse on duty and ask any questions they may have had. There was a great response to this and we plan to do it again next year.

To help raise funds for Hospice EBOP, 120 Kowhai trees were kindly donated to us to sell during this week and a raffle was also run, to win amazing hampers made up from various goodies mostly donated by Pak N Save Whakatāne. Thanks to these generous sponsors, just over \$1,700 was raised for Hospice EBOP.



Community Rememberance Trees and Raffle

Raised \$3343 for Hospice EBOP.

At the start of the Christmas Season, we held a week long fundraiser where three stands were set up in, or near, the three Eastern Bay of Plenty New Worlds. People were able to write a message on a card to a loved one, and hang it on the Christmas Tree. We had three stands set up, one at Whakatāne New World, Ōpōtiki New World and Kawerau Mall – all high traffic areas.

Our amazing volunteers sat behind the table and offered the cards for people to write and donate.

The event ran over five weekdays from 10am until 4pm, Nov 28th-Dec 2nd. This past year we ran an extra fundraiser selling Yellow Pōhutukawa, Mānuka Trees and Carex Virgata (Toi toi) which were all donated to us.

The total funds raised was \$3342.70 and the trees proved especially popular, with all of them apart from some toi toi, selling out and adding approximately \$1460 to our total funds raised.

Whakatāne raised \$1048, Kawerau raised \$578.70 and Ōpōtiki raised \$1716.





Whakatāne Sportfishing Club Charity Quiz Night

Raised \$12,000 for Hospice EBOP

Every 6 months the Whakatāne SportFishing Club host a Charity Quiz with the proceeds going to a charity of their choice. Hospice EBOP were chosen for the second charity of this year partly because one of the staff members had had someone recently go through Hospice.

As well as raffles throughout the event, the auction was the main fundraiser for which we had to source items to auction. We approached a few local businesses and they proudly donated products towards the auction, alongside auction items the club staff had sourced. We also did various forms of advertising through social media. On the night, we put in two quiz teams to show our support and to take part.

The event raised \$12,000 for Hospice EBOP and was primarily led by Whakatāne SportFishing Club. It was great publicity for Hospice EBOP creating a lot of awareness within the attendees, but also out in the community with adverts on the radio and a very positive article in the newspaper.

Our Hospice Shops

For the second year Hospice EBOP has had three Hospice Shops operating, one in each of the three regions in which our service covers, Whakatāne, Ōpōtiki and Kawerau.

Thanks to their amazing communities, the Hospice Shops have been able to make significant proceeds to help raise the money needed to continue supporting people living with life limiting conditions in the Eastern Bay of Plenty.

Hospice Shops Manager, Wendy Wright and her amazing team of shop staff and volunteers, have done an exceptional job at running the three Hospice Shops across the Eastern Bay of Plenty.


